It was a record-breaking year for the adoption program. 788 dogs were saved!

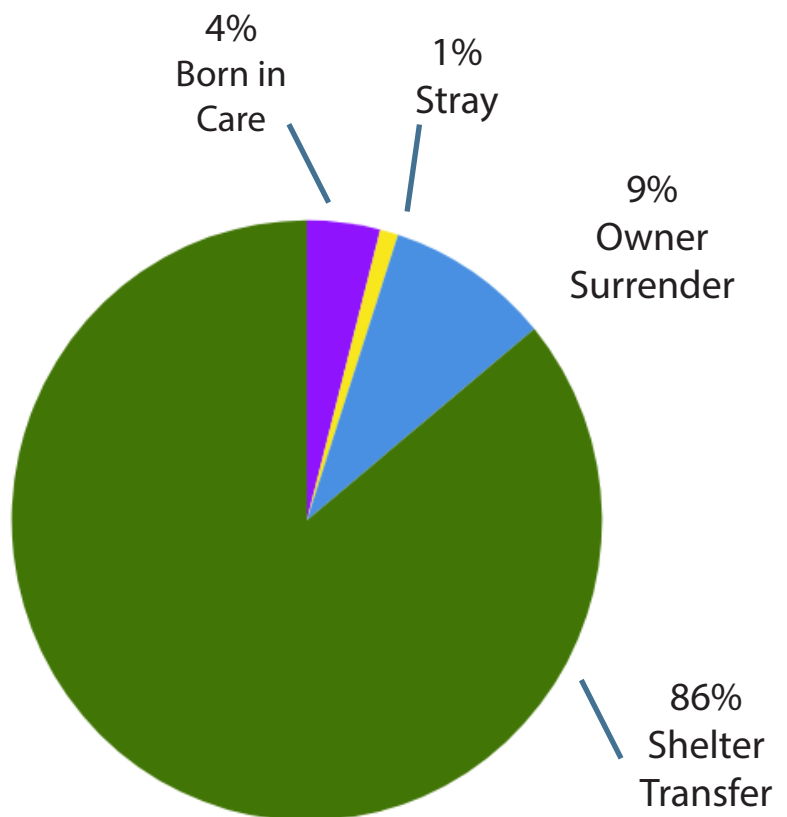
Many of the dogs in the program came from under-resourced shelters in Southwest Virginia.

The Adoption Program does not let background, shyness, illness, injury, or size of the dog determine if they are fit to be in this program.

## Adoption Program Philosophy

We helped 788 dogs and puppies (and 5 kittens) from under-resourced shelters and rescues in 2018. These dogs were in direct danger of euthanasia and needed our help the most. The shelter staff and volunteers work hard to save the dogs in their care but if there are not enough organizations pulling from them, euthanasia is a real possibility

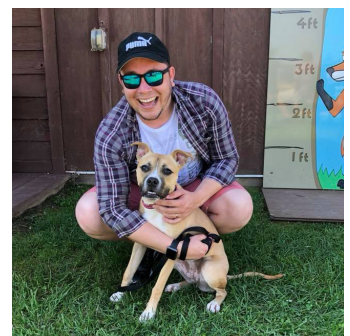
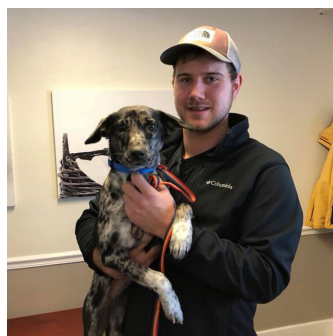
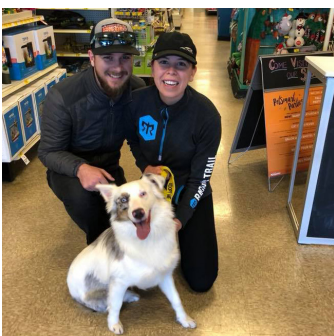
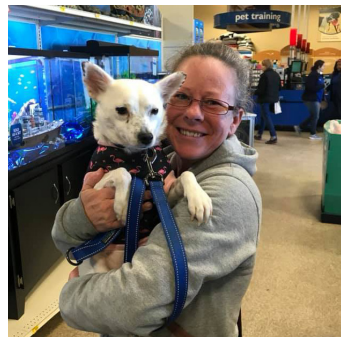
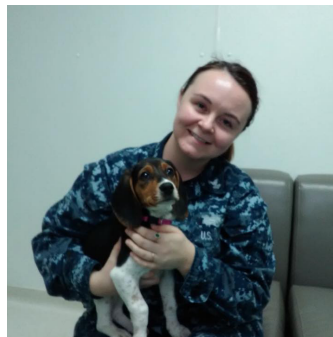
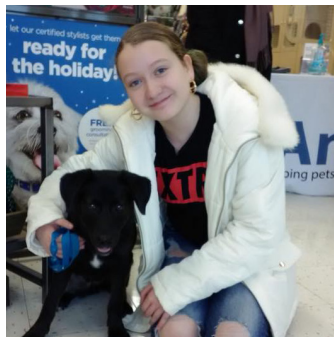
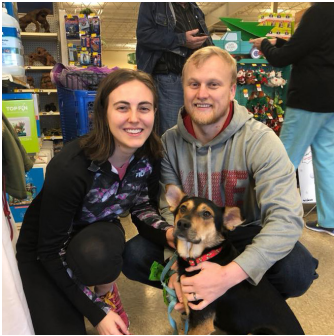

- Spay and Neuter Surgery



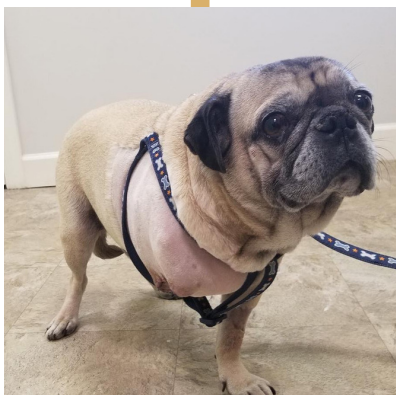

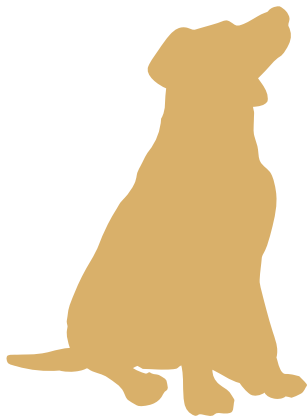

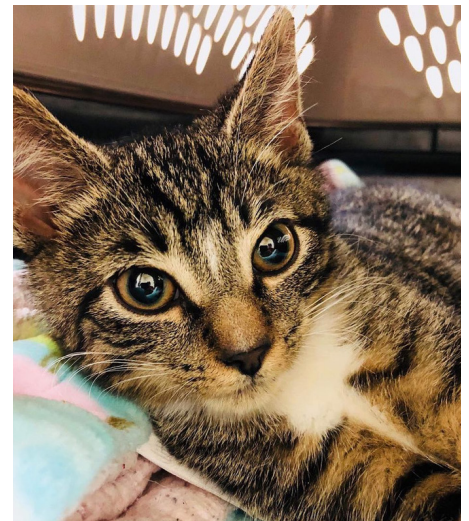

The third annual Walk for the Animals at Bluestone Vineyards included a puppy palooza, doggy games, unique silent auctions and vendors.



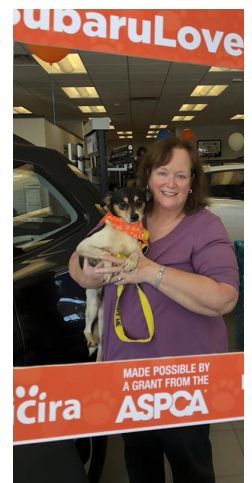
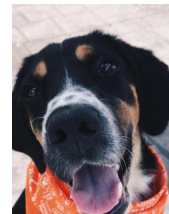


# Subaru Adoption Event
